However, more than 60% coverage for ALL of AT&T's LTE spectrum



Bottom Line: Public safety has more FirstNet coverage today than if this had been a Band 14-only network!



FirstNet Coverage

- How to achieve better coverage
 - -Fill in dead spots (in Process)
 - –Extend network coverage (in Process)
 - -Roll out Band 14 (in Process)
 - -Find additional funding to augment rural coverage
- State and federal agencies have rural funding grants available
 - -FirstNet coverage can be augmented



Overview

- Identify the champions and establish the program team
- Evaluate and prioritize grant/loan opportunities (DHS, FCC, EDA, USDA, and HUD)
- Review value-add to public safety
- Leverage benefits beyond public safety concurrent solutions
- Opportunities to offset resource impacts and costs
- Synchronize schedule with FirstNet State Plan timeline
- Deliverables and proposal



Rural Coverage

Formula for success


- Determine which federal grants meet the needs of the area
 - DHS/FEMA grants now available for FirstNet equipment
 - Poverty level, hardship industries, identified coverage gaps
 - Telemedicine, education, economic development, agriculture-related grants
 - Seek partnering opportunities with local telcos or utilities
 - Consider lower-cost, smaller-scale solutions

Caveats

- Applications are due at different times
- Some federal grant agencies believe only in fiber to the home
- Farmers and others who need rural broadband need it in the fields as well as schools and homes
 - ➤ The best way to approach these grants is with county-level buy-in and a good relationship with FirstNet/ATT
